The Port of Harlingen is an important economic hub of South Texas. Sitting on the Southern tip of Texas on the Arroyo Colorado River, the port is a shallow draft, inland port for barge and multimodal transport.

ECONOMIC HUB

The Port of Harlingen is located 25 miles inland of the Gulf Intracoastal Waterway. The Port connects our region with the entire Gulf of Mexico coast, and has access to several major markets through our connection with the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway, a 3,000 mile inland waterway along the Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico, from Boston, MA to the Southern Tip of Florida.

As part of the Foreign Trade Zone No. 62, one of the largest in the U.S., and the overweight corridor, the Port is a gateway for international commerce.

TONNAGE


The Port of Harlingen facilitates trade of dry and liquid cargo, including petroleum in Texas, Louisiana and Mexico. In fact, the Port delivers 70% of the refined petroleum products consumed in the Rio Grande Valley and imports 90% of the fertilizer consumed by local agricultural interests.




GROWTH

Year after year, The Port of Harlingen has experienced growth in tonnage moving in and out. The Port had a **9% increase in commodities** with a total of **3,292,930 tons** moving through our facilities in **FY22.** Since **FY17,** there has been **overall tonnage growth.**
